



General Safety Guidelines for Campers

COVID-19

The Event Sector Voluntary Code (Code) outlines a high-level overview of what the event sector can do to safely deliver events.

Eastercamp is committed to the Event Sector Code.

The Code provides best practice expectations on running events and is based on Ministry of Health guidance to reduce COVID-19 related risks. It will enable Eastercamp to appropriately support the Ministry of Health to contact trace if an outbreak of COVID-19 were to occur. The Code has been developed by the event sector in consultation with New Zealand Major Events at the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment.

What does the Code include?

- Commitment to the Ministry of Health guidance
- Facilitates effective contact tracing
- Record retention guidance
- Ways to ensure health of operators and attendees
- Encourages a culture of best practice COVID-19 risk management.

Under Alert Level 1 the Ministry of Health has deemed it safe for gatherings and events the size of EC21 to proceed.

Stay Safe at Alert Level 1:

- Maintain good hygiene
- Stay home if you're sick
- Get tested if you have cold or flu symptoms
- Keep track of where you've been

Stay home and don't attend Eastercamp if you are:

- Unwell
- A confirmed or probable case of COVID-19
- Waiting for a COVID-19 test result
- Self-isolating

General Safety Information

Always exercise common sense and good judgment:

- If you're concerned about something, say something by speaking to your Youth Leader, EC Safety Team or the EC Office.
- Look out for others.
- Carry details of any medications and allergies with you.
- Remain hydrated by drinking plenty of water - It's free!

When you are at the Big Top or EC Food Court:

- Take a moment to identify at least two exit routes from the building and emergency exit signs.
- If an alarm sounds, evacuate immediately. Follow directions from the Safety Team or Police.

Protecting your property:

- If parking onsite, lock your vehicle and hide valuables.
- If you lose property such as an eftpos card or wallet report it to the EC Office.
- Name everything!

Emergency Evacuations:

In the event of an emergency evacuation, make your way quickly and calmly to an emergency exit. Be aware of any hazards or dangers around you, and proceed to a safe area. Follow the advice of the Safety Team and/or Police. Do not put yourself in danger by stopping to collect belongings unless directed to. The full emergency evacuation procedure is the EC website on the downloads page.

Getting Around:

At peak times (Thursday night & Monday afternoon) traffic may be heavy and very busy. We recommend travelling to and from EC21 in a group bus or at the very least

by car-pooling. To arrange a group bus please speak to your Youth Leader. A 30KPH speed limit will be in place around the venue.

Weather:

The weather during Easter can change rapidly. In hot conditions, remember to drink plenty of water. If it becomes necessary to cancel or postpone any part of EC21 due to inclement weather (such as strong winds or heavy rain) updates will be issued on our Social Media Channels and through your youth group key leader. We recommend following Southern Eastercamp on **Facebook & Instagram**.

Enjoy the event and when in doubt, seek assistance from your Youth Leader, Camp Parents or our Safety Team.
